Abstract: An overview of the scientific literature from the year 2000 to 2013 is presented. This systematic review aims to provide support for public agents in their process of decision-making regarding the adoption of Information Systems by Governments. The Information Systems were classified in: Network Systems; Geographic Systems; Mobile Systems; Desktop Systems; Ontologies; Data Mining; Remote Sensing; and Simulation. ER00010	Sustainability of e-Learning Environment: Can Social Presence Be Enhanced by Multimedia? Hwang-Ji Lu Assistant Professor, Strayer University, USA Abstract: With the exponential development of Internet, distance learning has become an alternative means of taking a course or earning a degree. Social presence is a critical factor for forming and sustaining learning communities that support deeper learning through knowledge sharing. Social presence does not happen spontaneously and is in need of cultivation. This paper explores a review of the literature on social presence and the use of multimedia in distance education. The review of literature indicates that the advent of technological innovation in communications provides new mechanisms and opportunities in the distance learning environment. The findings from the literature review suggest that with the integration of multimedia into classrooms, instructors can increase social presence, enrich student's learning experience and raise student's satisfaction to reduce time and
	physical barriers existing in the online learning environment.

They are based in extensive bibliographic research, which makes them totally interactive learning objects. These models were generated in an open source software called BLENDER, and constitute a similar representation of human embryos and fetuses.
ER00014	Don't The Cobbler's Children Have Shoes? A Service Design Lens and Visualization Tools in Action in Higher Education Päivi J. Tossavainen and Virpi Kaartti Principal Lecturer, Laurea University of Applied Sciences; FINLAND Abstract: Service design has become a known framework within industry. Service design in business education can be seen as a vehicle to enhance innovativeness through visualization of holistic service development process. Evidence to this is a significant increase in studies that investigate the topic from different perspectives.

However, the use of service design inspired visualization in education has not yet been discussed. To address this gap, we examined, how visualization is used in teaching of Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programs. The investigation resulted in identifying the key aspects that underpinned the service design inspired visualization techniques. We integrate these key aspects into an overarching visualization roadmap for education purpose, which provides a substantial contribution by creating an integrated analysis of this phenomenon. Furthermore, we suggest three strategies for teachers in applying visualization in their education.

Use of Information and Communication Technologies in Public Schools of the State of Tocantins: teachers' perception

Abstract: The necessity of teachers' training has motivated numerous debates in the Brazilian educational scenario that has mobilized several public agents unleashing educational policies. The National Plan for the Formation of Teachers of Basic Education is a program aims to encourage and induce the provision of quality higher education to teachers acting in public schools. Learning using Information and Communication Technologies has induced cultural changes in the paradigms of school systems. The daily integration of ICT in schools stimulates the development of critical thinking, creative and cooperative learning, since it provides new and more possibilities to perform interactive activities. As a consequence, teachers' perception of technology based activities is crucial in the whole cycle of teaching and learning. Thus this quantitative research presents the perception by the teachers' enrolled in the PARFOR, at the Federal University of Tocantins, of the usage of ICT in public schools in the State of Tocantins, Brazil.

Assessing an E- learning and B- Learning Model – A Study of Perceived Satisfaction C. Quintas, I. Fernandes Silva, and A. Teixeira

Lecturer, Instituto Politécnico de Setubal, Portugal

Abstract: This study analyzes a postgraduate program, which has moved from face-to-face to b-learning and e-learning model, which has proved challenging for both students and lecturers in terms of adapting to the new environment.

Our aim is to analyze these processes, initially through a medium-term study on students' perceived satisfaction within the use of a Virtual Learning Environment and a social network.

We conducted semi-structured interviews to students to verify their perceived satisfaction on the program content and structure, as well as on its teaching methodology. We aimed to assess how useful students considered the new tools, articulating first and second stages of Kirkpatrick's Evaluation Model (Kirkpatrick, 1998).

Taking the results coming from our reading of learning processes, we have then moved on to a second stage, focusing on evaluation of learning, i.e. through analysis

	of the grades obtained by the students. Hands-on and practical work are determinant		
	for the assessment of learning, in such a way that the objectives held by each subject		
	are fulfilled. The evaluations showed positive results, showing no differences		
	between the students on an e-learning format and those on the b-learning method.

	Abstract: This paper reflects on a research that was carried out in Turkish secondary

	limited in showing students' attitudes to using tablets outside the school and the

A Review of the Use of Information Technology in Brazilian Schools from 2010 to 2014

Eurival Alves de Souza, Leandro Guimarães Garcia, **Janio Carlos Nascimento Silva**, Leonardo Guimarães Garcia and Patrick Letouze

Professor, Instituto Federal Do Tocantins – Campus Porto Nacional, Brazil

Abstract: The paper discusses the presence of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in Brazilian schools, based on documents of the last five years obtained from two sources: the Brazilian Internet Steering Committee (CGI.br) database that stores surveys on the use of information and communication technologies in Brazilian schools; the Scientific Electronic Library Online (SciELO) database – a prominent Portuguese and Spanish repository of scientific journals. The CGI.br surveys indicate slow improvements (mainly related to the growing number of mobile ICT in schools) but important limitations (low speed of Internet at schools, low investment in teachers training, low equipment number, etc.). Even under these conditions, it outlines the trend of using ICT mobile devices that shifts the ICT usage from computer labs to the classroom. The latest scientific studies on ICT retrieved from SciELO corroborate this perception, based on an analysis of all ICT and virtual tools considered by researchers, as well as the context in which the studies were performed (including the research and teaching methods, and type of courses considered).

Driver Factors Of Knowledge Worker Team Innovation

Mustafa D. Mutlu

Abstract: In our well developed world today knowledge work and teamwork is becoming crucial particularly in innovation oriented economies. Innovation based organizations, which are called as knowledge intensive firms are becoming well aware of the importance of new knowledge creation. These firms are different in many ways from traditional firms and employ knowledge workers who are well qualified experts. These workers are responsible for innovation through working in teams. In literature, there is a growing interest on innovation related team processes, which are seen as significant for teams to obtain their targets. The team climate inventory (TCI) approach introduces team level psychological safety, support for innovation, shared objectives and task orientation among team members as innovation related team processes. Although these determinant processes of

team-based innovation may be relevant, new findings in innovative group contexts indicates the importance and necessity of additional innovation related processes for knowledge worker teams. According to recent claims and findings creative abrasion, cognition, trust development, absorptive capacity and communication in teams may also have relevant effects on innovative performance. Therefore, this paper is a theoretical review of team level innovation and it will introduce the additional innovation related processes that have been unearthed in recent research.

Role Play and Project-Based Learning as a Pedagogic Practice to Improve Motivation and Adoption in Elective and Complementary Courses

Maria Del Pilar Diaz Jaimes and Adriana Rocío Lizcano Dallos

Professor, Universidad industrial de Santander, Colombia

Abstract: Motivation to learn administrative basic elements by students of academic programs in which the administrative component is an essential academic area is different from the motivation generated by learning these elements by students of academic programs that not include it as program core, but as a professional elective or as a complementary area, and this imposes an additional challenge to the teaching practice.

This study describes an experience that seek to generate greater motivation in learning the course "Business Management 1" for students of diverse undergraduate academic programs of the Industrial University of Santander by the use of two strategies: role play and project-based learning.

As a result, the positive and negative perceptions of students and the teacher, the results of peer assessment and external peer assessment of implemented activities are presented.

In general, adoption of course concepts by students has increased as well as the interest shown towards it, generating a high perception of the course usefulness in professional life.

Universities More than Knowledge: Foster the Quality in Research Processes **Jaddy Brigitte Nielsen Niño**

Abstract: Research is not a new discussion topic for the Colombian academic community. Therefore, institutions of higher education such as Universidad La Gran Colombia attempt to generate alternatives to foster research processes in undergraduate students. Unknown, this is a difficult task for researchers because they are usually reluctant to search, track and appropriate knowledge supported with solid theoretical basis that allow them to generate an academic discourse beyond the collective imagination. In fact, this research was focused on creating academic writings from comparative researches that were enhanced and contextualized within the international seminar held at the Missouri State University in the United States of America. The analysis of data shows that the research process is always a joint task as there is an academic discipline from the student and constant feedback from the

professor or researcher.

Abstract: Transdisciplinarity is a research strategy that is increasingly employed in a multitude of fields. Communication between the actors is of importance when it comes to ensuring successful collaboration. In order to assess communication processes in a transdisciplinary research alliance, a process screening questionnaire has been developed that can be easily evaluated and thus allows timely feedback to the actors. The process screening questionnaire has been utilized repeatedly on a specific research alliance. This article describes the scientific basis for the development of the process screening questionnaire, exemplifies its application, gives a summary of the results of this specific use, and summarizes benefits and future measures of improvement.

The photoset as a qualitative research tool designed from a semiotic perspective **Dora Ivonne Alvarez Tamayo**

Professor-RESEARCHER, UNIVERSIDAD POPULAR AUTÓNOMA DEL ESTADO DE PUEBLA (UPAEP), MEXICO

Abstract: Considering the need to integrate resources and techniques to access the mind of consumers to communicate brand positioning in a coherent and integrated way, the research team that I lead to work on branding for a college graphic design program for a private university in Puebla, has developed an exploratory study for which it has been designed a set of qualitative instruments from a semiotic perspective. The instrument presented in this document is called "photoset". It is a projective technique association consisting of selecting a set of images that are

brought into contact with the user to perform interpretations, from which the researcher takes notes and draws conclusions from contextual, metaphoric, metonymic and associated elements. In this case, the photoset was designed to understand the symbolic values associated to the graphic design as a profession. The results obtained using the photoset allows to analyze the configuration of the semantic field of a segment, in this case applicants to an undergraduate academic program, to design persuasive communication strategies. The instrument designed and the analysis was performed based on the semiosis model by Morris (1994) and supported by Eco's theory of codes: syntactic, semantic and pragmatic s-codes.

The myopic and intertemporal demand for infrastructure in a multi-asset allocation framework

Zaghum Umar

Assistant Professor, Suleman Dawood School of Business, Lahore University of Management Sciences, Lahore, Pakistan

Abstract: This paper employs a multi-asset allocation framework to analyze the short-term and long-term desirability of listed infrastructure investments in an investor's portfolio. Using monthly data from 1973-2015, the study calculates the short-term and long-term welfare losses associated with ignoring the demand for infrastructure investments in an investor's portfolio. Given the long-term nature of infrastructure projects, it compares the demand characteristics of infrastructure to those of medium/long-term bonds. The results show infrastructure as a desirable portfolio component for both short-term and long-term investors.

Relation between EVA® and Capital Structure in the worldwide steel mill industry in economic crises: a study from 2006 to 2011

Johan Hendrik Poker, Victor Maschietto Murakami and Márcio Marcelo Belli Faculdade de Ciências Aplicadas - FCA - UNICAMP - Brazil

Abstract: Purpose – This paper aims to test whether the economic value added (EVA®) was a determinant of the changes in the capital structure in the worldwide steel mill sector during economic crises. Design/methodology/approach – The long-term effect of changes in capital structure on firm value is examined, using a sample of 361 steel mill companies during the period from 2006-2011. Findings – The null hypothesis was rejected. Evidence is found to support a significant relationship between the changes in economic value added (EVA®) and the changes in debt ratios. To assess the strength of this finding, control variables were taken into account. Similar results were obtained. Originality/value – This paper is one of the first ones to analyze the relationship between economic value added and financial structure changes during economic crises with a focus on steel mill industry.

A Decision-Making Technique for Financial Grant Allocation to Research Projects Fagno Fonseca, **Marcelo Lisboa**, David Prata, and Patrick Letouze Federal University of Tocantins, Brazil

Abstract: The importance of financial support to scientific research is increasing due to international competition. Consequently, National, State and institutional foundations that provide financial grant to research projects face the responsibility of selecting projects efficiently. Hence, this paper proposes a technique to support the decision-making process of grant allocation to research projects. The selection process aims maximizing the overall cost-benefit relation. The data used in this study were from financial grant bids of the Research Foundation of the State of Tocantins – FAPT, in Brazil. The selection problem in question is a variation of the classic combinatorial optimization problem, which can be solvedby the Tabu Search algorithm. Results have showed that this optimization technique provides a quick and accurate support to the selection process considering cost-effective criteria.

The Systematic Risk of the Brazilian Textile Industry: Consequences of Their Increasing International Exposure

Jefferson Bution, Gilmar Masiero, and Fábio Oliva

School of Economics, Business and Accounting, University of Sao Paulo (FEA-USP), Brazil

Abstract: The systematic risk of multinational companies (MNC) has been discussed as consequence of their internationalization and home country development levels. Some scholars have early found evidences that the classic theory of portfolio diversification was able to explain the lower systematic risk of MNC in comparison to their domestic counterparts. Conversely, later studies suggest that the systematic risk of American MNC have grown with their international exposure. The current paper considers the experience of public Brazilian textile companies to investigate the relationship between their international exposure and systematic risk. This industry was selected as a focus of the investigation due to sample screening. The research found two groups of companies separated by a clear hiatus. The first, with lower international revenue, could not have their systematic risk explained by the internationalization aspect. The second, with higher revenue from the external market, corroborated the previous evidences of risk elevation as consequence of internationalization. Among the applicability of such findings are the better usage of the discount rates for managers when planning international projects and capital structure. Finally, some insights on the hiatus, limitations of the small sample size and future studies suggestion were discussed.

Competitiveness Model for Restaurants based on Customer Satisfaction

Abstract: Growth in the restaurant industry is faced with a disadvantage against well-structured national and international chains, this research depicts the influence of client satisfaction at the competitiveness of the restaurant industry in Puerto Vallarta. The methodological design was non experimental, correlational, with a sample rate of

383 costumers. The findings show that factors tangibility with a value of .98, response with a value of .73 and pay .35 worth, these factors are more related to the competitiveness of the restaurants, this according to the empirical data of customers surveyed.
